On October 25th, 2009, the Wright Image Group hosted its first orientation for prospective members in the Wright B Flyer hangar at Dayton-Wright Brothers Airport in Springboro. The event, attended by75 potential new members, was a big success. In the setting of full scale flying models of the Wright B, attendees enjoyed grilled hamburgers and hot dogs with all the trimmings.

The main event was a presentation by Walt Hoy, explaining what the Wright Icon is all about, why we need it and how we're going about getting it built. That was followed by Steve Brown, whose company, Brown & Bill's Architects, Inc., designed the monument as it is currently envisioned. Steve also set up a large scale mockup of the

Stepping Out On Design Development

The Wright Image Group is close to taking its first concrete, money-spending step towards completing the iconic Wright Flyer monument at the intersection of I-70 and I-75. With his initial design concept as a starting point, our architect, Steve Brown, president of Brown and Bills Architects, has estimated the cost of completing design development work at \$175,000 – assuming no unanticipated major design problems. All that money is not yet on hand – we're still about \$65,000 short of the goal – but the board feels that taking concrete steps soon with the funds available would enhance our ability to solicit further contributions from all quarters. Success builds upon success!

Success Builds Upon Success! Steve would begin with a defined work package that would cost less than \$40,000 – one half from funds on hand, and the other half from a matching funds pledge. With that money, Brown and Bills would accomplish a Preliminary Plan and Elevations, the initial phase of actual design development for the project. Included in the work package would be the preliminary load calculations based upon our current design concept. They may also be able to get started on the second design development task, an Analysis of Materials. This analysis includes the most challenging of the design issues we face – the foundation for the platform, the cables for the vertical supports (the "tower"), the tower itself, and lastly and most demanding, the Flyer and its connection to the supporting pedestal. Brown and Bills will have to put most of this work on contract or find pro bono support. The foundation work can be done with minimal outside help, and that would be included in this initial funded work package. Work can probably be completed within two months of starting.

monument, a table top display about seven feet tall, for all to appreciate the engineering achievement that it will represent.

Highly visible at this first major event for the WIG were the new light blue "corporate color" polo shirts worn by all board members. Procured by board member Jon Kurtz, president of Creative Banners, Flags and Poles, and embroidered with the Wright Icon logo, these shirts are also now available to the public. (See adjacent box)

Many of the people attending were strongly interested in supporting the effort and made a total of \$1580 in donations. Treasurer Jacqueline Nawroth processed 12 supporting member applications at the time of the event, yielding \$295 in dues. We received twelve more memberships by mail a short time later, and the WIG continues to solicit & receive memberships from interested supporters.

The third and final design development task is completing a Preliminary Site Design. Remaining work on the Analysis of Materials and this Preliminary Site Design will be done as quickly as time and contributions allow! You can expect that we will partition the remaining work into discreet packages (as this one has been) to allow the soonest possible completion of design development. Then we'll be ready to start actual construction drawings and work. Of course, fund-raising will need to reach a much higher plateau to support that final stage, but having the design development work done will enable us to credibly answer questions like, "How much will construction cost?" and "How long will it take?" and "What will the Flyer weigh?" It will bestow a much higher level of confidence and certainty on the monument project and ao a long way in helping us raise the additional funds!
